

- **5.1. Delegates to Provincial Synod:**
 - **5.1.1.** The results of balloting in congregations on March 9th were as follows:

A special meeting of Island Conference was held online on March 16th at 7:30 p.m. to have an online election to break the tie for the second and third Lay Delegate. 5.2. Synod:

- 5.2.1. The 34th Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province will be held in the Trinidad Conference in July 2025. The Synod will be both virtual and in-person. Synod will convene virtually on May 15, 2025 and June 12, 2025 to conduct housekeeping matters and to receive reports. The in-person sessions will be held from July 10 16, 2025 in Trinidad, with the 10th and 16th being travels days.
- 5.2.2. The Congregations of the Province are being asked to cover the fees and costs of their Pastor(s)/Clergy Delegate(s) as usual. The estimated cost per delegate from Barbados is BD\$3,000, covering a Synod Fee of US\$1,000 and travel cost from Barbados to Trinidad of approximately BD \$1,000.
- 5.2.3. As per the Book of Order (Paragraph 4.17), members of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province may submit proposals on any aspect of our church's life, for resolution at the 34th Provincial Synod. Proposals should be seconded by a member of the Moravian Church and submitted to the Conference Office by February 14th, for consideration by the Island Conference and further submission to the Provincial Office by April 15, 2025.
- 5.2.4. Please begin to make preparations and to pray for the Synod.

6. From the Provincial Board:

- 6.1.Please be advised that the Rev. Denise Smith-Lewis, Acting Superintendent of the Moravian Church Antigua Conference and Pastor of the Cedar Hall and Cashew Hill congregations, will proceed on furlough from April 1 to June 30 and August 15 to September 15, 2025. During this period, the Rev. Nevin Lewis, Pastor of the Lebanon and Newfield congregations, will assume responsibility for the Superintendency. We kindly ask for your prayers and support for Rev. Smith-Lewis, Rev. Lewis, and the entire Antigua Conference as they navigate this time of transition.
- 6.2. The 5th Unity Women's Consultation will be held in North Carolina, USA from June 1 8, 2025. This event brings together women from throughout the Moravian world to discuss matters pertinent to the gospel and women. The Ministers of Christian Education chose Sis. Laurine Richards of the Antigua Conference to represent the Eastern West Indies Province at this consultation. Please pray for Sis. Richards as she prepares for the consultation.

The service of ordination will take place on Sunday, July 13, 2025 at 3:00 p.m. at the Memorial Moravian Church in Trinidad. Please pray for Sis. Browne as she prepares to take her vows.
- 7.2. The Opening Service for the 34th Provincial Synod, will take place on Sunday, July 13, 2025 at the Regent Star Hotel in Piarco, Trinidad at 9:00 a.m. The service will be streamed live.
- 7.3. The Closing Service for the 34th Provincial Synod will take place on Tuesday, July 15, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. at the Regent Star Hotel in Piarco, Trinidad. This service will be streamed live.
- 7.4. Please continue to pray for the 34th Provincial Synod that the purpose of God is established.


