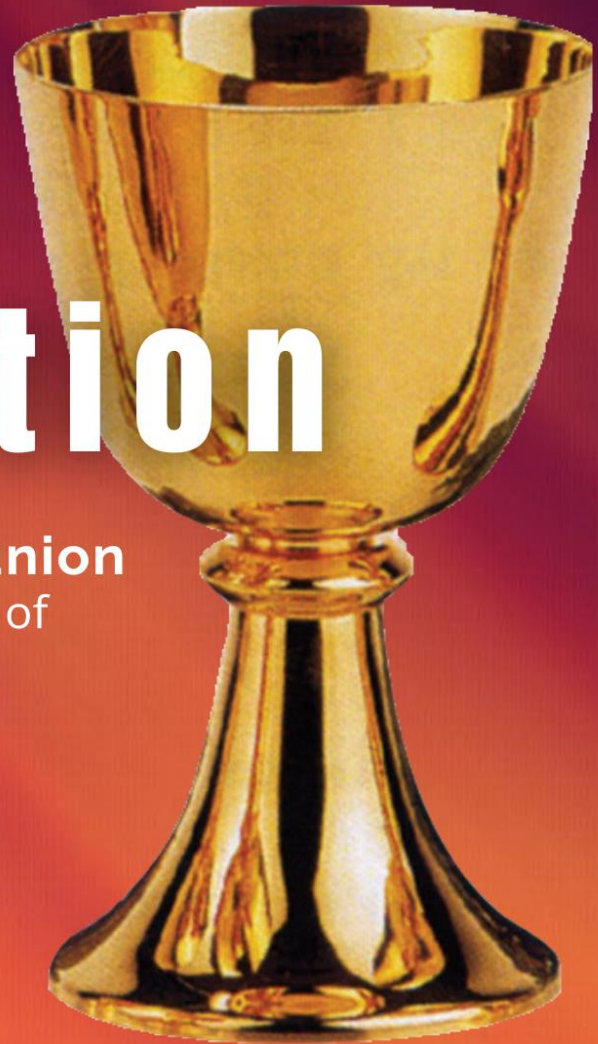

- Please note the following re the 33rd Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province:
 1. **Meeting and Venue:** The Synod was convened online on Thursday,

June 23, 2022 at 6:00 pm. Procedural matters were addressed. The Opening Service and Retreat will be held on Sunday, June 17th. The main business sessions will be held July 18-22, 2022. The Synod will be a hybrid meeting, in that, delegates will meet in their Conferences and then connect with the Provincial Headquarters and the other Conferences via web conferencing software. The Barbados Conference will meet at the D. C. Moore Centre.

2. **Opening Synod Service:** The opening service will be led from Cashew Hill, Antigua on July 17, 2022 at **9:00 a.m.** with participation from all Conferences. Congregations are asked to adjust their time of worship and join this worship service from their respective sanctuaries. Congregations that are unable to receive the video stream will be advised how they can participate by their local pastor.

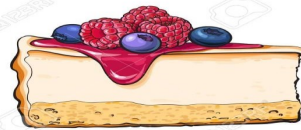
