1. The Provincial Board makes the following announcements:

- ✠ Provincial Day of Prayer comes up on September 1, 2023. On this Day of Prayer, Congregations are asked to arrange times of prayer for our students, schools, colleges, universities, teachers, education personnel, and parents as the new school year begins. Let us also pray for safety during the hurricane season. Our Caribbean brothers and sisters in Haiti need our prayers as well. Keep praying for the Unity Board meeting which begins on September 1st and Unity Synod which begins on September 4th. As people of faith, we believe that God hears and answers our prayers.
- ✠ The Provincial family extends condolences to the family of the late Sis. Annette John Nelson, daughter of the late Rev. Alva John of Tobago. Sis. Annette died on August 16, 2023, and will be buried at the Montgomery Moravian Church in Tobago on September 1, 2023. Please pray for the family in this time of grief and loss.
- ✠ Unity Synod will be held from September 4 – 10, 2023 in South Africa. Unity Synod is the highest decision-making body of the world-wide Moravian Church and is held every seven years. In addition to the Chairman, the Province will be represented by the Rev. Erwin Warner, Superintendent of the St. Kitts Conference and Sis. Beverly Job, treasurer of the Trinidad Conference. Unity Synod will be preceded by a meeting of the Unity Board from September 1 – 3, 2023 which the Chairman will attend. Your prayers are requested for the Unity Board meeting and Unity Synod.
- ✠ The Chairman will be out of office for Unity Synod and Vacation leave from August 28 – September 12 and September 13 – September 30, respectively. Rev. Dr. Adrian Smith, Vice Chair of the Province, will act as Chairman in his absence.
- ✠ The Rev. David Ince who currently serves as the Supplementary Associate Pastor of the Bethlehem and Faith Pastorate in Barbados has accepted a call to serve as the Supplementary Associate Pastor of the Sharon and Dunscombe Pastorate in the Barbados Conference. This call takes effect from September 1, 2023.
- ✠ The PEC offers congratulations to Sis. Tia Phillip of the Cana Congregation in the Antigua Conference on being elected to serve on the
