





Ministry of the Word:

First Scripture Reading: Acts 4: 5 – 12

- 5. And it came to pass on the morrow, that their rulers, and elders, and scribes,
- **6.** And Annas the high priest, and Caiaphas, and John, and Alexander, and as many as were of the kindred of the high priest, were gathered together at Jerusalem.

- 7. And when they had set them in the midst, they asked, By what power, or by what name, have ye done this?
- **8.** Then Peter, filled with the Holy Ghost, said unto them, Ye rulers of the people, and elders of Israel,
- **9.** If we this day be examined of the good deed done to the impotent man, by what means he is made whole;
- **10.** Be it known unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by him doth this man stand here before you whole.
- 11. This is the stone which was set at nought of you builders, which is become the head of the corner.
- **12.** Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.



Second Scripture Reading: John 10:11 – 18

- 11. I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.
- 12. But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep.
- 13. The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep.

- **15.** As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep.
