Ministry of the Word:

First Scripture Reading: 2 Samuel 7:1 – 11, 16

- 1. And it came to pass, when the king sat in his house, and the LORD had given him rest round about from all his enemies;
- 2. That the king said unto Nathan the prophet, See now, I dwell in an house of cedar, but the ark of God dwelleth within curtains.
- **3.** And Nathan said to the king, Go, do all that is in thine heart; for the LORD is with thee.
- **4.** And it came to pass that night, that the word of the LORD came unto Nathan, saying,
- **5.** Go and tell my servant David, Thus saith the LORD, Shalt thou build me an house for me to dwell in?

MORAVIAN MEMORIAL DAYS

May 12: The signing of the Brotherly Agreement which marked the Renewal of the Unitas Fratrum at Herrnhu
