2. From the Provincial Board:

2.1. Sister Anthea Barrow who has been in the call process in the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province and is a member of the Bethlehem Congregation in the Barbados Conference, has accepted a call to serve as Associate Pastor of the Cedar Hall and Cashew Hill Moravian congregations in the Antigua Conference. Sis Barrow will serve with Rev. Denise Smith-Lewis. This call takes effect from February 16, 2026. Please pray for Sis. Barrow, the Antigua Conference, and the Cedar Hall and Cashew Hill family as they make this transition.

3. From the Superintendent:

3.1. A “Love Offering” will be received in our Moravian congregations in Barbados on Sunday, February 15, 2026 to assist those in Jamaica who are recovering, following the passage of Hurricane Melissa (October 28, 2025). In the immediate aftermath, the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province provided counselling and logistical assistance through Rev. Neilson Waithe and the Jamaica

- Province. Now we seek to offer financial assistance as the rebuilding effort continues. Many in the areas affected are still without housing and utilities. Please contribute as you are able and as the Holy Spirit leads. All funds received will be forwarded directly to the Jamaica Province to aid the recovery. Your generosity will also serve as a tangible reminder to our Moravian siblings that they are not alone – we stand with them.
- 3.2. The Provincial Board invites the prayers of the Province for the Grenada Mission. As they continue to minister faithfully in Mount Tranquil, Grenada, they are without the immediate presence of a Pastor. For the next two Sundays, Bro. Daniel Mark will be there to provide pastoral leadership and presence. Sis. Adelyn Mgonela from the St. Kitts Conference will do the same for the following Sunday. There will be a similar arrangement next month providing pastoral leadership and presence. As you pray, please also listen for God’s call on how you may support the Grenada Mission with your presence or your resources.
 4. We have closed our year of celebrating 225 years since the laying of the cornerstone here at Sharon. One planned event remains outstanding, that is the Planting of a Time Capsule, which will be completed when all the items have been gathered.
 - 4.1. We are still open to contributions under our “225 for 225” drive, in which we ask persons to donate \$225 or multiples of \$225 towards the continuing work of the church. 
