

First Scripture Reading: Genesis 2: 15 – 17, 3: 1 – 7

- 15 And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it.
16. And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat:
17. But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.

The Moravian Church – March of Witness Part 1

A "March of Witness" is a public procession, where believers walk through villages to outwardly express their faith, share the gospel, and pray for the community. These Marches, serve as a visible, peaceful testimony of the Christian's belief. The Moravian Church holds this annual event around the world to celebrate the founding of The Unitas Fratrum (Moravian Church) on March 1, 1457. It highlights the church's ongoing commitment to Christian witness, fellowship, and service. The March further serves as a public demonstration of faith, meant to "give witness to Christ" and remind the community of the church's ongoing presence and mission.

5. We have closed our year of celebrating 225 years since the laying of the cornerstone here at Sharon. One planned event remains outstanding, that is the Planting of a Time Capsule, which will be completed when all the items have been gathered.




