Ministry of the Word:

First Scripture Reading: 1 Samuel 3:1 – 14, 19 – 20

- 1. And the child Samuel ministered unto the Lord before Eli. And the word of the Lord was precious in those days; there was no open vision.
- 2. And it came to pass at that time, when Eli was laid down in his place, and his eyes began to wax dim, that he could not see;
- **3.** And ere the lamp of God went out in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was, and Samuel was laid down to sleep;
- 4. That the Lord called Samuel: and he answered, Here am I.
- 5. And he ran unto Eli, and said, Here am I; for thou calledst me. And he said, I called not; lie down again. And he went and lay down.
- 6. And the Lord called yet again, Samuel. And Samuel arose and went to Eli, and said, Here am I; for thou didst call me. And he answered, I called not, my son; lie down again.
- 7. Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, neither was the word of the Lord yet revealed unto him.

- 8. And the Lord called Samuel again the third time. And he arose and went to Eli, and said, Here am I; for thou didst call me. And Eli perceived that the Lord had called the child.
- **9.** Therefore Eli said unto Samuel, Go, lie down: and it shall be, if he call thee, that thou shalt say, Speak, Lord; for thy servant heareth. So Samuel went and lay down in his place.
- **10.** And the Lord came, and stood, and called as at other times, Samuel, Samuel. Then Samuel answered, Speak; for thy servant heareth.
- 11. And the Lord said to Samuel, Behold, I will do a thing in Israel, at which both the ears of every one that heareth it shall tingle.
- **12.** In that day I will perform against Eli all things which I have spoken concerning his house: when I begin, I will also make an end.
- **13.** For I have told him that I will judge his house for ever for the iniquity which he knoweth; because his sons made themselves vile, and he restrained them not.
- 14. And therefore I have sworn unto the house of Eli, that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be purged with sacrifice nor offering for ever.
- **19.** And Samuel grew, and the Lord was with him, and did let none of his words fall to the ground.
- **20.** And all Israel from Dan even to Beersheba knew that Samuel was established to be a prophet of the Lord.



Second Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 6:12 – 20

- **12.** All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any.
- **13.** Meats for the belly, and the belly for meats: but God shall destroy both it and them. Now the body is not for fornication, but for the Lord; and the Lord for the body.
- **14.** And God hath both raised up the Lord, and will also raise up us by his own power.

- **15.** Know ye not that your bodies are the members of Christ? shall I then take the members of Christ, and make them the members of an harlot? God forbid.
- **16.** What? know ye not that he which is joined to an harlot is one body? for two, saith he, shall be one flesh.
- **17.** But he that is joined unto the Lord is one spirit.
- **18.** Flee fornication. Every sin that a man doeth is without the body; but he that committeth fornication sinneth against his own body.
- **19.** What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?
- **20.** For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

1. The Provincial Board (PEC) announces the sad news of the death of Bishop Hopeton Clennon on January 7, 2024. Bro. Clennon was consecrated a Bishop of the Moravian Unity on October 25, 1998, being the 320th bishop of the Unity since its start in 1457, and the 258th bishop of the Renewed Moravian Unity. Bishop Clennon was the preacher at the consecration of Bishop Conrad Spencer on 22nd November 2015. Bro Clennon shared in numerous conferential events over the years as well as facilitate mission trips to various Conferences. The funeral service for Bishop Hopeton Clennon takes place at Central Moravian Church in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania on January 20, 2024.
