

MINISTRY OF THE WORD

First Scripture Reading: Psalm 40: 1 – 11

- 1. I waited patiently for the LORD; and he inclined unto me, and heard my cry.
- 2. He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings.
- **3.** And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the LORD.
- **4.** Blessed is that man that maketh the LORD his trust, and respecteth not the proud, nor such as turn aside to lies.
- 5. Many, O LORD my God, are thy wonderful works which thou hast done, and thy thoughts which are to us-ward: they cannot be reckoned up in order unto thee: if I would declare and speak of them, they are more than can be numbered.
- **6.** Sacrifice and offering thou didst not desire; mine ears hast thou opened: burnt offering and sin offering hast thou not required.
- 7. Then said I, Lo, I come: in the volume of the book it is written of me,
- **8.** I delight to do thy will, O my God: yea, thy law is within my heart.
- **9.** I have preached righteousness in the great congregation: lo, I have not refrained my lips, O LORD, thou knowest.
- **10.** I have not hid thy righteousness within my heart; I have declared thy faithfulness and thy salvation: I have not concealed thy lovingkindness and thy truth from the great congregation.
- 11. Withhold not thou thy tender mercies from me, O LORD: let thy lovingkindness and thy truth continually preserve me.



Second Scripture Reading: John 1: 29 – 42

- **29.** The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.
- **30.** This is he of whom I said, After me cometh a man which is preferred before me: for he was before me.
- **31.** And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing with water.

- **32.** And John bare record, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon him.
- **33.** And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost.
- **34.** And I saw, and bare record that this is the Son of God.
- **35.** Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples;
- **36.** And looking upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God!
- **37.** And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.
- **38.** Then Jesus turned, and saw them following, and saith unto them, What seek ye? They said unto him, Rabbi, (which is to say, being interpreted, Master,) where dwellest thou?
- **39.** He saith unto them, Come and see. They came and saw where he dwelt, and abode with him that day: for it was about the tenth hour.
- **40.** One of the two which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.
- **41.** He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ.
- **42.** And he brought him to Jesus. And when Jesus beheld him, he said, Thou art Simon the son of Jona: thou shalt be called Cephas, which is by interpretation, A stone.
