In celebration of Heritage Month:

THE SHARON CHURCH

The recognition of our Moravian Heritage this month comes to a close with a look at the Sharon Church. The Moravian mission in Barbados began in 1765, with services at Bunker's Hill, (Old Sharon) St Thomas. This building at Sharon dates back to 1799 and has survived the great hurricane of 1831, along with slave uprisings. Sharon is the first Moravian church in Barbados and has been featured on the 15 cents stamp. Its European architecture has allowed it to be listed by the Barbados National Trust as a historical building worthy of preservation – an edifice built by slaves for slaves. The steeple at Sharon is unique, and is used as a landmark for many a traveller. The pulpit is the steeple upside down and once rested solely on a tree stump now on display at the back of the church. The 'roundabout' outside

represents the map of Barbados, with the Rose of Sharon tree in the middle – where St Thomas is. A heritage like no other – rich and one to be proud of!!!

FOR ANNOUNCEMENT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Warm Christian greetings in the name of Jesus, our Chief Elder.

The Synod Planning Committee along with the Provincial Board makes the following announcement in relation to the 33rd Provincial Synod to be held virtually from July 17 - 22, 2022:

- 1. The pre-synod events planned for May 26, 2022 and June 16, 2022 have been cancelled. Instead, Synod will convene virtually on June 23, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. for two hours where preliminary matters will be settled. Another session will be held on June 30, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. to begin receiving reports.
- 2. The opening service will be streamed live from Cashew Hill on July 17, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. with participation from all Conferences. More details will be shared later. It is expected that members will join this worship service from their respective sanctuaries.
- 3. Voting at Synod for PEC, Bishop, Unity Synod Delegate, and any other special elections will be done via a dedicated app created for this event.
- 4. Each delegate to the 33rd Provincial Synod must have a mobile device such as a smartphone, a tablet, or a laptop. Delegates must also have an active email account.
- 5. Synod registration is US\$50 per delegate.
- 6. Observers may visit the site where their Conference delegates are meeting. However, the numbers of observers will be in accordance with the local Covid-19 and Conference restrictions.
- 7. Registration for Synod will begin in the week of May 22, 2022.

Please be in prayer for the 33rd Provincial Synod that all the logistics come together and the will of God is done.









Protocol for Worship Services during the COVID-19 Pandemic – 2022

In keeping with the directive given by the Prime Minister of Barbados:

- 1. Sanitisation stations shall be set up at the entrances and exits which shall be manned by ushers.
- 2. All attending shall sanitise their hands upon entering the church.
- 3. The names of all who attend service shall be recorded.
- 4. The temperature of each worshipper and minister shall be taken before entering the church, using a contactless thermometer;
 - **♦** persons whose temperature exceed 37.5° C shall not be allowed to enter the church;
 - * persons who are coughing repeatedly, sneezing or exhibit any flu-like symptoms shall not be allowed to enter the church.
- 5. Face masks shall be worn throughout the service by all persons present in the church. Worship Leaders may remove their masks temporarily to fulfil their roles, provided that there is at least six (6) feet between leaders, and between leaders and congregants.
- 6. There shall be no physical contact between attendees.
- 7. There shall be a physical distance of at least three (3) feet between all attending except between members of the same household who may sit together; in which case, there shall be a distance of at least three (3) feet between one group and adjacent groups or individuals.
- 8. Attendees shall be asked to deposit their offerings in fixed containers.
- 9. No hymnals, Bibles, leaflets or other materials shall be distributed to worshippers;
 - **♣** Bibles, hymnals etc. should only be shared by family members;
 - **▶** The Lectern Bible shall also be removed and lesson readers shall be asked to use their own Bible.
- 10.Infant Baptism, Confirmation, and rites involving the laying on of hands or anointing have been suspended for the time being.
- 11. Windows and doors shall be kept open to allow for ventilation.
- 12.Attendees shall be asked to maintain the recommended social distance when leaving the building.
- 13. There shall be no congregating of worshippers inside or outside of the church, before or after service.
