


Hymn 466 -

MINISTRY OF THE WORD

First Scripture Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

- **8.** For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:
- **9.** (For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;)

- **10.** Proving what is acceptable unto the Lord.
- **11.** And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them.
- **12.** For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret.
- **13.** But all things that are reproved are made manifest by the light: for whatsoever doth make manifest is light.
- **14.** Wherefore he saith, Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light.

- **3.** Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him.
- **4.** I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work.
- **5.** As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.
- **6.** When he had thus spoken, he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay,
- 7. And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam, (which is by interpretation, Sent.) He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing.
- **8.** The neighbours therefore, and they which before had seen him that he was blind, said, Is not this he that sat and begged?
- **9.** Some said, This is he: others said, He is like him: but he said, I am he.
- **10.** Therefore said they unto him, How were thine eyes opened?
- 11. He answered and said, A man that is called Jesus made clay, and anointed mine eyes, and said unto me, Go to the pool of Siloam, and wash: and I went and washed, and I received sight.

THE BAPTISM OF INFANTS

The Liturgy should be introduced at a suitable point in a service of public worship.

The congregation being seated and the child/children to be baptized and the parents or sponsors and god-parents being in place, the minister says:

Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the Kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive

the Kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' And he took them up in his arms, and blessed them.

As we share in this sacrament of baptism, we affirm our belief that baptism points to the grace of God freely given to all who avail themselves of it. We believe that all who are born into the world are children of God, made in his image. We acknowledge the fatherly and motherly love of God, revealed to us in Jesus Christ, and we pray that in due time *this child* may display in *his/her* life the gracious marks of a child of God.

Let us profess together the faith of the Church.

We believe in God the Father, creator of the universe. We believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, redeemer of the world. We believe in the Holy Spirit, giver of life.

The parents/ or sponsor/s and god-parents stand. The minister addresses them:

Earnestly believe that our Saviour Christ loves *this child*, that he is ready to receive and embrace *him/her*, to give *him/her* the blessing of eternal life, and to make *him/her* a partaker of his everlasting kingdom.

Our Lord has promised to grant the things which we ask in his name, which promise he for his part will most surely keep and perform.

Do you, for your part, make confession of the faith wherein *this child* is to be baptized, in God as your heavenly Father, in Jesus Christ as your Saviour and Lord, and in the Holy Spirit as your Sanctifier?

Answer: We do.

Do you promise, in reliance on divine grace, to teach *him/her* the truths and duties of the Christian faith, and by prayer, precept and example, to bring *him/her* up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and in the fellowship of the Church?

Answer: We do.

May God give you grace and wisdom to provide a caring and loving Christian home for this *new life* committed to your charge.

The minister addresses the congregation:

All standing.

Will you as a congregation accept *this child* as *a new member* of the Christian Church? Will you, by your witness, set a good and joyful example of fellowship, service and love?

Answer: We will.

This hymn verse is sung:

New life, O Lord to you we bring, Giver of all, our Friend, our King; Receive him/her in your strong embrace, Within your Church give him/her a place; A lifelong friendship here begin, And grace, a crown of life to win.

Moravian Alternative Order 1987, anon.

Almighty and everlasting God, whose son Jesus Christ was carried as a child into the Temple, and who himself took little children into his arms and blessed them, look mercifully upon us now, and bless what in your name we do. May *this child*, now to be baptized into the Church, the body of Christ, by the work of the Holy Spirit grow into the likeness of *his/her* Saviour. May *he/she* in time be led to take a full part as *a member* of the Church. And by your grace may *he/she* remain your faithful witness all *his/her* days.

Each child is presented to the minister who baptizes him/her with water saying:, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Lord bless you, and keep you;
The Lord make his face to shine upon you,
And be gracious to you;
The Lord lift up his countenance upon you,
And give you peace.

In the name of Jesus. Amen.

After all have been baptized, the congregation says:

We receive this child into the Church, in the trust that hereafter he/she shall not be ashamed to confess his/her faith in Christ.

All seated.

Let us pray:

Lord Jesus, Son of God, Saviour, Have mercy upon us.

By your human birth,

By your obedience, diligence, and faithfulness,

By your life, suffering and death,

By your resurrection, and ascension,

By your continuing presence,

By your Church's teaching and worship,

Bless us now and always.

O God, we praise you for the mercies of birth, and for all the joy and blessing that children bring into the home and into the world. We give you thanks today for the safe arrival of *this child* and ask your blessing on *him/her* and all those who have responsibility for *his/her* care. May they, and all who share in the nurture of children, find great happiness and fulfilment in their ministry of love.

Heavenly Father, hear us.

O Christ, the friend of children everywhere, the faithful protector of all who are weak and small: keep, guard and bless your children. Through the work of your Spirit help them to grow in strength and beauty of character, and closer to you.

Jesus, Saviour, hear us.

Holy Spirit, bless us all and renew us this day. Help us to surrender ourselves to you, so that we, and the children committed to our care, may lead lives worthy of you, and of the family of Jesus Christ.

Holy Spirit, hear us. Amen.

The congregation shall pray together:

O Lord, help us to think more deeply on the true significance of this holy sacrament. Forgive us for the times when we have come short of the grace of our own baptism, by wandering from your ways: and bring us back with a perfect repentance. Renew us in this moment.....By the power of your Holy Spirit, help us to be loving, teach us to be humble and strengthen us to live godly lives, as those who have been baptized by the same Spirit into one body; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

NEWS, INFORMATION & REMINDERS

- 1. Please be reminded of your special Unity offering which is collected in all Moravian Churches worldwide on Unity Sunday each year (the First Sunday in March). This year the offering will go towards creating the Moravian Unity Disaster Fund as required by Unity Synod 2016. This fund will provide assistance in the event of natural or artificial disasters. If you have not already done so, you can bring in the specially marked envelope in your box of envelopes or you can mark "Unity Offering" on an envelope and present it.
- 2. The Moravian Women's Fellowships and the Youth of the Barbados Conference will host a Moravian Heritage Tour on Saturday, March 25, 2023. You are invited to join what will be a stirring tour and learn about the role and contribution of the Moravian Church to the development of religion and education in Barbados. Retrace the steps of our ancestors as we visit historic sites of the Moravian schools, churches and significant sites. Buses will leave Calvary Moravian Church, Roebuck Street at 9:30 a.m. Please be on board by 9:15 a.m. The fare is \$35.00. Call 850-9669 for your tickets.
- 3. The Women's Fellowship will hold a Farmer's Market immediately after Church on Sundays. Seventy-five percent (75%) of the financial proceeds will go to the Church. Items will cost either \$3.00 or \$5.00.
- 4. Our annual fund-raising Easter Monday Fish-Fry will be held on April 10, 2023. We look forward to the usual assistance of the congregation in the donation of food items and in the sale of tickets.
- 5. From the Chairman of the Provincial Board:
 - **♥** Sunday March 26, 2023 is Theological Education Sunday. At this time of year, we focus on encouraging people to respond to the call of God on their lives.
