 - 4.2.5. Clifton Hill / Centenary Friday April 11, 2.01 a.m. 12.00 Noon. [10hrs]
 - 4.2.6. Mount Tabor / Penuel Friday April 11, 12.01 p.m. 12:00 Midnight. [12hrs]
 - 4.2.7.  - 4.4.1. The 34th Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province will be held in the Trinidad Conference in July 2025. The Synod will be both virtual and in-person. Synod will convene virtually on May 15, 2025 and June 12, 2025 to conduct housekeeping matters and to receive reports. The in-person sessions will be held from July 10 – 16, 2025 in Trinidad, with the 10th and 16th being travels days.
 - 4.4.2. The Congregations of the Province are being asked to cover the fees and costs of their Pastor(s)/Clergy Delegate(s) as usual. The estimated cost per delegate from Barbados is BD\$3,000, covering a Synod Fee of US\$1,000 and travel cost from Barbados to Trinidad of approximately BD \$1,000.
