

- 1. As the 2023 2024 academic year opens for the majority of institutions this week, we pray for all students, teachers and staff of our educational institutions. We congratulate and encourage all who will move from one level to the next, especially those who are beginning their Secondary education. Maintain focus and remember that God's enabling help is available to you.
- 2. Our Missionary Festival is scheduled for Sunday, October 22, 2023 in the morning service. We hope to raise \$13,000 this year and we remind you of your Missionary Collection Boxes and your Missionary Envelopes. Direct contribution can also be made and contributions in memory of loved-ones. Funds raised will go towards local missions, and to missionary endeavours across the region and the world through the various mission organisations of the Moravian Church.
- 3. Our Harvest celebration this year will be coupled with our Flower Festival 2023; these are scheduled for the weekend of November 11th & 12th 2023.


